







Suspect a Stroke?

BE FAST!

	B alance	Is there a sudden loss of balance or coordination?
	E yes	Is there sudden loss of vision in one or both eyes?
	F ace	Ask the person to smile. Look for facial droop or a lopsided grin.
	A rm	Have the person close his/her eyes and hold both arms out with palms facing up. Look to see if one arm drifts down, or if he/she experiences weakness, tingling, or inability to move an arm or leg.
	S peech	Check to see if the person is slurring words, speaking nonsense, or not able to talk at all.
	T ime	Note the time the symptoms started, or the last time the person was known to be well. This is important information for the medical team treating the patient.
